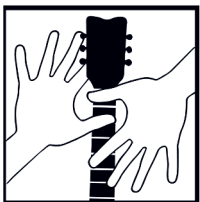

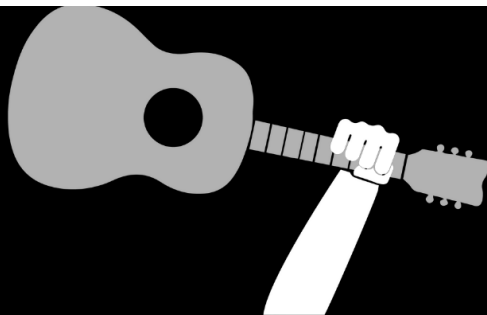

# JULY

**1 Lost Leaders** Byron Isaacs of The Lumineers and singer-songwriter Peter Cole make anthemic pop-rock songs using vintage synthesizers, guitar pedals and intimate vocals.

**2 Little Folks Show: Tracy Bonham Presents Topsy Bonsai's Melodeon Music House** Celebrated '90s rocker Bonham created Topsy to teach the fundamentals of music and mindfulness through song and story. A fun musical journey engaging heart and body!

**2 Tracy Bonham** Like Alanis Morissette and Liz Phair, Tracy Bonham made her name during the alt-rock boom of the mid-'90s. Conservatory trained in classical violin, jazz and rock, she has never ceased growing. She has revisited some of her breakout songs, stripping them down for an acoustic trio.

**7 Nordlys Global Voices: Kaleta & Super Yamba Band** Fronted by Afrobeat and Juju veteran Leon Ligan-Majek of Lagos, Nigeria. His NYC Super Yamba Band of drums, percussion, sax and trumpet features former members of David Byrne, Rubblebucket and Yeasayer.

**8 Alex Bechtel's 'Penelope' performed by Grace McLean / Orchard Project Arts Festival** (*Repeats Sunday at 3 PM*) Songs written from the point of view of Penelope, Odysseus' wife. Bechtel's unique and captivating musical is led by Grace McLean (Natasha, Pierre and the Great Comet of 1812, In the Green) who plays the title role with stunning vocals and pathos.

**9 Kruger Brothers** . Over the course of two decades, the Swiss born Krugers exquisite bluegrass, jazz and classical amalgam has put them at the top of the USA bluegrass scene.

**10 Eastbound Jesus** Hailing from Washington County, NY they blend country, bluegrass & rock with layered harmonies & songs of the rural working class soul.

**12 Chuck Lamb Trio with special guest Rob Paparozzi** GRAMMY-nominated harmonica master Paparozzi has worked across the music spectrum since 1967, embracing rock, blues & jazz.

**13 Nordlys Global Voices: Franciso, El Hombre** A fast-rising young Mexican-Brazilian band that mixes folkloric Latin rhythms with jubilant gypsy spirit and thrilling energy!

**14 Thor Jensen *Album Release*** In the last decade he played Americana with Quiet Life, then pivoted into the breakneck Gypsy jazz of Stephane Wrembel Band, then joined world/roots band Hazmat Modine. He'll be joined by Nick Anderson (drums) and Ari Folman-Cohen (bass).

**15 Folk Heritage Series: Robin & Linda Williams** Over four decades their beautiful southern mountain, gospel-infused songs

have won the hearts of audiences around the world and been recorded by major stars. *The Folk Heritage Series is Made Possible by the Charlie Pickett & Kathleen Rehl Endowment Fund*

**16 John Kribs & the K&O Folk Show *Album Release*** Father & son John & Orion Kribs are stellar players whose Americana reflects a lifetime of making music together.

**17 Steel Wheels** This Virginia-based Americana band lives in the creative space between the familiar sounds of the Virginia mountains where they met, but always pushing forward into today's roots styles.

**19 Rochmon Record Club: Amy Winehouse "Back to Black"** Alyssa Vosgianian takes the big chair for this month's deep dive into Amy Winehouse's second and last album, "Back to Black".

**21 Them Coulee Boys with Mama Said String Band** Two super fun, hot bands! Soren Staff and Beau Janke joined by brothers bringing mandolin, bass and drums. They've become a rollicking outfit taking the Midwest by storm. Louisville's Mama Said String Band recently won Best Bluegrass Band in the Appalachian Arts and Entertainment Awards, and Bluegrass Artist of the Year in the Lexington Music Awards!

**22 Bob Holz & A Vision Forward** Veteran jazz drummer Holz has worked with stars David Newman, Cornell Dupree, Parliament Psychedelic and regularly with Larry Coryell. Tonight his trio plays easy flowing, sometimes smooth & sometimes funky, melodic new jazz.

**23 Heather Maloney Trio** Her gorgeous, bouyant indie-folk songs are moored in deep spiritual practice & reverence for Joni, Rilke, Ken Burns, and Zen parables.

**24 Nefesh Mountain** They bring Jewish-American culture, tradition, values and spirituality to a potent repertoire of Bluegrass and Americana. "They preach peace, understanding and acceptance with musical muscle." (Rolling Stone)

**28 The Brother Brothers** Identical twins Adam and David Moss are virtuosic fingerpickers with lush Simon & Garfunkel harmonies. Millions have streamed their crowd-pleasing folk harmonies on Spotify.

**29 Shamarr Allen & The Underdaws *Album Release*** Hailing from New Orleans' Lower 9th Ward, jazz trumpeter Shamarr Allen spreads Louisiana spice wherever he goes. Jazz-funk-pop that's celebratory, loving & proud!

**30 Lindsey Webster Band *Album Release*** Charismatic vocalist Wester spans the worlds of R&B, Pop, Rock, Jazz and beyond. She has garnered two #1's and seven Top 10's on the Billboard Contemporary Jazz Chart.

**31 Bright Series: The Abrams** Country originals with an explosive energy that's both bucolic and metropolitan. They made their debut at the Grand Ole Opry at the age of 15. Now in their twenties, they make good honest roots music.

**4 Bright Series: The RTs** Boisterous

horns, impassioned vocals & a driving groove. It's rock, funk & acoustic punk all rolled into one swaggering, blazing good time!

**5 Radney Foster** After 30 years in the music business, Texas singer-songwriter Radney Foster has an uncanny knack for connecting with an audience. With numerous Billboard Country Top 10 hits, his shows are a perfect blend of new treasures and beloved classics.

**6 Little Folks: Novus Cantus** With a flair for storytelling & theatricality, these brothers have created a show for kids that draws on their love of world music, rock and classical. Parents will recognize nods to Jethro Tull, Rusted Root, Gypsy Kings and Metallica.

**6 American Patchwork Quartet** Made up of GRAMMY-winners guitarist/vocalist Clay Ross, drummer Clarence Penn, vocalist Falu Shah, and highly acclaimed bassist Yasushi Nakamura, APQ interprets centuries-old American folk songs that highlight America's immigrant roots, building bonds across cultures and color lines.

**7 Let It Be & Abbey Road - Back to Back** An all-star lineup of Hudson Valley musicians performs two iconic albums. Joey Eppard on vocals and guitar, Leslie Ritter on vocals, Scott Petito on bass, Jeff Mercel on drums, Danny Blume on guitar, Dave Payette on keyboard & Andy Stack on guitar.

**9 Nordlys Global Voices: Vieux Farka Touré** Often referred to as "The Hendrix of the Sahara" he's a Malian singer-songwriter who updates West African tradition. Following in the footsteps of his father, the legendary Ali Farka Touré, Vieux has reached a global audience with authentic African roots music that will resonate with fans of American blues.

**11 Rory Block** "Her playing is perfect, her singing otherworldly as she wrestles with ghosts, shadows and legends." -*New York Times* Heralded as "one of the greatest living acoustic blues artists" (Blues Revue), Block makes Delta Blues tradition connect with 21st century audiences.

**12 Jamcrackers** This beloved Adirondack folk trio blends folk and blues, ballads, gospel, dance tunes and activist anthem, sparking a rare chemistry and a guaranteed good time for all ages.

**13 Folk Heritage Series: Joe Mullins & The Radio Ramblers** Named Entertainers of the Year by the International Bluegrass Music Association, these radio chart-toppers play regularly on the Grand Ole Opry. Enjoy Bluegrass Gospel at its best!

**14 Misty Blues** Original and traditional blues with hints of jazz, soul, funk and tent revival gospel. Lead singer Gina Coleman has led her Berkshires-based band to the finals of the International Blues Challenge, and into the studio with heavy-hitters Charles Neville and Joe Louis Walker.

**18 Addison Agen** Best known as Season 13's first runner up on

*NBC's The Voice*, Addison's warm, rootsy pop songs are woven of nostalgia, acceptance, hope and joy. Her unaffected voice and open heart inspire honesty and reflection.

**19 An Evening of Roots & Rockabilly: Marty Wendell & His Tour Band and The Bluebillies** Weaned on an old Philco radio, Wendell is the real deal, having shared the stage with the likes of T. Graham Brown, Carl Perkins and Johnny Cash. The Bluebillies embody country music, reviving tradition with spirit and gusto.

**20 Glen David Andrews** This acclaimed New Orleans vocalist and trombone player was born in New Orleans' historic Tremé neighborhood, the oldest Black community in the USA. Jazz, gospel, rock, blues and funk with Andrews leading a killer band!

**21 Grace Kelly** Saxophonist Kelly has rocked the jazz world with sold-out concert halls, 13 acclaimed albums and a resume that includes Barack Obama's inauguration and a stint in the house band for "The Late Show with Stephen Colbert" – all before reaching her mid-twenties. Her electric charisma and infectious positivity weave through jazz, funk, and ballads.

**24 Ethan Crowley *Album Release*** Saratoga singer-songwriter Crowley's contemporary ballads embrace reggae, jazz and synth-pop.

**25 Stephane Wrembel *Quartet*** One of the world's foremost gypsy jazz guitarists, Wrembel learned his craft around Roma campfires in the French countryside. His original compositions have been featured in three of Woody Allen's movies and in major concert halls around the world.

**26 Chris Brubeck's *Triple Play*** Peter Madcat Ruth (harmonica & percussion), Joel Brown, (guitar) and Chris Brubeck (electric bass, bass trombone, piano). They bring joy, virtuosity, and American spirit to folk, blues, jazz and classical music.

**27 Martin Sexton** This fiercely independent singer-songwriter has influenced a generation of contemporary artists. His songs have appeared in numerous films & TV shows, but it's his potent stage presence, honest lyrics, and vocal prowess that keep fans coming back for more.

**28 Stacey Kent** She's a globally-renowned jazz singer with a warm, intimate style in the mold of the greats. Her album sales have reached Gold, Double-Gold and Platinum, with many songs topping the jazz charts.

**30/31/1 Richard Thompson** Powered by evocative songcraft, jaw-dropping guitar playing, and powerful charisma, Thompson's influence cannot be overstated. He's one of Rolling Stone's "100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time," and the OBE was personally bestowed upon him by Queen Elizabeth II.
